guided walk. The sun was out, but the wind was strong. Within a very short time of leaving the Discovery Centre we saw two male Wheatears, John informed us that they used to be known as 'white arse'. Their white bottoms are very clear when they are in flight. These birds are the first migratory birds to arrive here, they usually appear during the first and second week in March.

As we made our way towards the Green Beach we were greeted with the song of the Skylark. John explained that the Carrion Crows keep a close eye on



the Skylarks, as they try to locate the nests to raid them.

John brought our attention to the other birds that were around on that day such as Greenfinches, Dunlin, Cormorants, Sand Martins and Meadow Pipits.



There were several swallows around but these are in decline due to climate change and less food being around for them.

The importance of the various plants that grow on our sand dunes was explained to us. In Ainsdale a number of rare plants can be found and John was very excited about these. The presence of these plants show that the sand dunes are healthy.

We were privileged to see a Tiger Beetle, that was sunning itself on the path. Many other insects were around too. Within the next couple of months the dunes will be full of colour with the various orchids that flower as well as the Everlasting Pea, which

is invasive and is now spreading around the dunes in this area.

John manged to field all the questions we threw at him, he is such a knowledgeable person. W call came away with a lot more comprehension of what is on our doorstep, or should I say on our sea front?







### **INVENTORS & INVENTIONS** Who were they & what did they invent



### **ANSWERS**

- 1. Alexander Graham Bell (born 1847)
- 2. Gutenberg invented the first movable type for printing on a printing press
- 3. Sir Tim Berners Lee invented the World Wide Web
- 4. Henry Ford invented the assembly line to produce his Model T cars in the 1920's
- 5. The Wright brothers made their first powered flight in 1903
- 6. Samuel Morse, of course, invented morse code but he also invented the single wire telegraph system
- 7. Sir Clive Sinclair launched the C5 to a great fanfare in 2010, but mainly safety concerns prevented it from taking off
- 8. Alfred Nobel invented both Dynamite and Gelignite
- 9. They co-founded Apple, launching their first Apple computer in 1975
- 10. In 1825 Stephenson built the first commercial steam locomotive to carry passengers, and in 1830 he built the first commercial inter-city railway from Liverpool to Manchester
- 11. Elisha Otis invented the elevator together with a device to stop them falling if the drive cable snapped
- 12. Nikola Tesla invented the concept of alternating current electricity supply
- 13. Percy Shaw invented "cats eyes" patented the invention, and set up a company which was the sole supplier for the whole country
- 14. James Hargreaves invented the "Spinning Jenny" which helped to mechanise the weaving industry in the North of England
- 15. Peter Zinovieff created the electronic sythesizer adopted by many bands in the 60's including Pink Floyd and David Bowie
